



How to Play Roulette – Rules and Beginner’s Guide

Roulette Rules: Understanding the Basics

How do you play roulette?

To get started, you need to understand the basic rules of the game.

Here’s a quick overview:

The aim: Predict where the ball will land on the numbered wheel.

The bet: Place chips on a number or group of numbers.

The payouts: Win between 1x and 35x your bet, depending on how specific your prediction is.

This is the essence of how to play roulette. In short, you place bets on the numbered board, and if the ball lands on your chosen spot, you win.

How Does Roulette Work?

Roulette works by matching the numbers on the spinning wheel with those on the betting board. This dual setup lets you place bets on spots corresponding to locations on the wheel. If your bets align with where the ball lands, you win.

One of the best things about learning how to play roulette online is that it's a game for everyone. You can make general picks or specific predictions, giving you a level of control over the risk you're willing to take.

For instance, if you prefer lower-risk bets, you can place your chips on larger sections of the board. If you're willing to take a higher risk for the chance of bigger payouts, you can bet on individual numbers. We'll explain the different types of bets in the next section of our roulette guide.

The key point to understand now is that roulette offers a lot of options. You can choose to play it safe for smaller payouts or take on more risk for the chance of larger rewards. Few online casino games offer this flexibility, which is why roulette remains so popular.

How to Play Roulette: Your Betting Options

To play roulette successfully, you must know how to place your bets. As mentioned, you can be general or specific with your predictions. For example, you could try to predict the exact number where the ball will

land. Alternatively, you could bet on a group of numbers with similar characteristics. If the ball lands on any of these numbers, you win.

It's also important to note that some roulette variants have slightly different rules. For example, in European roulette at Wild Casino, the payout for a single number bet is 30x, while at BetOnline, it's 35x. These variations affect the payouts and can make the experience slightly different.

Before we go into the specifics of different roulette variants, let's take a look at the standard betting options and their associated payouts.

Inside Bets aka Specific Picks

Inside Bet	Example	Payout
Straight Up (one number)	27	35x
Split (two neighboring numbers)	17/20	17x
Street (three numbers in a line)	1/2/3	11x
Corners (four connected numbers)	20/21/23/24	8x
Six-Line Bet	1/2/3 + 4/5/6	5x

Outside Bets aka General Picks

Outside Bet	Example	Payout
Column	12 numbers in a column	2x
Dozen	12 numbers on a third of the board	2x
Odd	All the odd numbers	1x
Even	All the even numbers	1x
Red	All the red numbers	1x
Black	All the black numbers	1x
1-18	All the numbers from 1 to 18	1x
19-36	All the numbers from 19 to 36	1x

We've categorised the bets as 'inside' (specific) and 'outside' (general), helping you tailor your roulette strategy based on your risk tolerance. If you're willing to take on more risk for higher payouts, choose inside bets. If you'd prefer lower risk with smaller returns, opt for outside bets.

How to Place a Bet

By now, you should have a good grasp of how to play roulette, whether online or at a land-based casino. Here's a quick overview of the essentials:

- A roulette wheel with black and red numbers (1-36) plus a green zero.
- A betting board that mirrors the numbers on the wheel.
- A ball dropped onto the spinning wheel, landing in a slot to decide the outcome.
- Chips to place your bets on where you think the ball will land.

Now, let's walk you through the steps for playing roulette online:

1. Use our secure links to sign up at a recommended online casino.
2. Complete the registration, applying any promo codes for a welcome bonus.
3. Log in and visit the cashier page.

4. Select a payment method and make a deposit.
5. Head to the game lobby and find roulette games.
6. Pick a roulette game and select your chip denomination.
7. Place your chips on the numbers you predict.
8. Watch the wheel spin and see if your bet wins!

Different Ways to Play Roulette

This guide has covered the basics of how roulette works, how to place bets, and the payout structure. These tips are universal across all versions of the game.

However, roulette isn't a single game; there are various types you can play online. Some popular variants at our top-rated UK online roulette casinos include:

American Roulette

American roulette tables feature 38 numbers, setting them apart from European versions. This extra number is the double zero (00), which sits alongside zero (0), making the numbers range from 00 to 36.

European Roulette

A European roulette table closely resembles an American one, with one key difference: it doesn't have a double zero (00). This leaves 37 numbers in total, ranging from 0 to 36. With a maximum payout of 35x, the house edge in European roulette is 2.7%.

Winning Strategies & Expert Tips

Learning to play roulette is one thing, but mastering it is another. Many players use well-known strategies, like the Martingale system. Here, we'll keep it simple and share our top tips to help you play better when you try roulette online:

1. Balance Risk and Reward

Decide on your preferred level of risk before you start playing. Different bets carry different risks; single-number bets are riskier but offer bigger payouts, while bets covering groups of numbers reduce risk. Focus on balancing risk with potential rewards to find a betting style that suits you.

2. Make the Most of Bonuses and Features

Our recommended online casinos offer welcome bonuses and ongoing promotions, often providing bonus credits you can use for roulette (subject to wagering requirements). Also, take advantage of any unique game features. For instance, in French roulette, you can get 50.

3. Stay Within Your Limits

The final tip is all about managing your bankroll. Only bet what you can afford to lose, using disposable income for your gaming. Each bet should be a small part of your total funds—for example, if you have £500 to play with, keep individual bets under 1% (around £5 or less).
